## POSITION HIGHLIGHTS

- For future academics to engage in a comprehensive, transdisciplinary training program in child maltreatment science
- Specialize in two of four training tracks:
  - a) Biology and Health
  - b) Developmental Processes
  - c) Prevention and Treatment
  - d) Policy and Administrative Data
- Choose mentor team from 13 faculty experts in child maltreatment and 25 faculty from various fields
- Receive training in research ethics, professional development, and grant writing
- Gain experience in implementing research and translating findings to influence child maltreatment practice and policy
- Participate in a summer institute in partnership with other P50 centers
- Attend P50 child maltreatment centers meetings at NIH

Penn State University is also home to the **Translational Center for Child Maltreatment Studies** - a NICHD P50 Capstone Center of Excellence in Child Maltreatment Research and Training. Fellows on the T32 have the opportunity to work on several large-scale research projects that include child welfare-involved youth, intervention and prevention studies, and longitudinal studies on predictors of child maltreatment, youth and family outcomes, and child welfare involvement and service outcomes.

Each fellow builds their individualized mentor team from 38 Penn State Faculty members.
