

Presentation Highlights

- Investments in the evidence and the implementation supports are needed to improve outcomes.
- Value of CAPTA as the only federal legislation that funds capacity building for primary prevention of child abuse and neglect.
- Investments in prevention, including parent supports, build measurable capacity growth at the local level.
- Investments in evidence supported programs substantially increases federal returns based on fewer hospital admissions for child abuse, out-of-home placements, and slower growth in child maltreatment cases¹

- Successful and sustainable implementation does not happen naturally
- Poorly implemented programs can result in harm to participants
- High return on investment

Improves parenting skills and confidence




Intensity of intervention

North Carolina's Tiered Model




Getting to Outcomes



Key Take-Aways

 Effective investments = state and federal implementation supports and capacity building at the local level.

 Federal investments in prevention and parent supports are yielding measurable and sustainable capacity growth to deliver Triple P in NC.

 Federal *leadership* through CAPTA reauthorization enables the **innovative public-private partnerships** responsible for scaling Triple P.



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
